### **PACKET 4 DAY 2: PACKET 2 REVIEW**

### **Notes:**

- Every sentence in English must have at least one verb and one subject.
- The verb in a sentence is always related to the subject.
- Subject = a noun or pronoun that performs the action of the sentence
  - Examples: <u>Sam</u> threw the ball to Tommy.
    - Riding a bike is difficult for a small child.
- Verbs express: action (eat, stop, make); states of being (am, seem, appear);
   or mental states (know, think feel).
- Preposition = a word or set of words that indicates location (*in, near, beside, on top of*) or some other relationship between a noun or pronoun and other parts of the sentence (*about, after, besides, instead of, in accordance with*).
- A prepositional phrase will begin with a <u>preposition</u> and end with a <u>noun</u>, <u>pronoun</u>, <u>gerund</u>, or <u>clause</u>, the "object" of the preposition.
  - Example: She threw the can (in the recycling bin).
